#### INVESTIGATIVE ASSIST SUMMARY REPORT

#### I. AUTHORITY

The Florida Department of Corrections, Office of the Inspector General, by designation of the Secretary and § 944.31, Florida Statutes, is authorized to conduct any criminal investigation that occurs on property owned or leased by the department or involves matters over which the department has jurisdiction.

The testimony references included in this report are summations of oral or written statements provided to inspectors. Statements contained herein do not necessarily represent complete or certified transcribed testimony, except as noted. Unless specifically indicated otherwise, all interviews with witnesses, complainants, and subjects were audio or video recorded.

#### II. METHODOLOGY

The investigation reviewed the derivations of the allegation advanced by the complainant. The scope of this investigation does not seek to specifically address tort(s), but violations of criminal statutes. The criterion used to evaluate each contention or allegation was limited to the following standard of analysis:

1. Did the subject's action or behavior violate Florida criminal statutes?

#### III. ANALYSIS

The standard and analysis in this investigation is predicated with the burden of proving any violation of law, established by probable cause. The evidence considered for analysis is confined to the facts and allegations stated or reasonably implied. The actions or behavior of the subject are presumed to be lawful and in compliance with the applicable Florida law, unless probable cause indicates the contrary.

#### IV. DEFINITIONS

#### **Unfounded:**

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause does not exist to suggest the suspect's behavior or action occurred nor is an arrest or formal charge being initiated.

#### **Closed by Arrest:**

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause exists that an identified subject committed the offense and one for which an arrest or formal prosecution has been initiated.

#### **Exceptionally Cleared:**

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause exists that an identified suspect committed the offense, but one for which an arrest or formal charge is not initiated, or in the case of a death investigation, one for which no evidence exists that the death was the result of a crime or neglect.

#### **Open-Inactive:**

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which a criminal investigation commenced, but where evidence is insufficient to close as unfounded, closed by arrest, or exceptionally cleared.

### **Investigative Assist Closed**

Refers to a disposition of an investigative assist, where the conduct being investigated by the outside agency did not concern allegations against a Department employee, contractor, inmate, offender, or other person either employed or under the supervision of the Department.

#### ٧. **PREDICATE**

On or about July 5, 2017, the Department of Corrections, Office of the Inspector General received notification of the death of Inmate Ramon Morales #168554, who was housed in L dormitory at Calhoun Correctional Institution, Work Camp. Upon initial review of the information, the Office of the Inspector General assigned an investigative assist to Inspector Ken Futch on July 10, 2017, to assist the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) with their investigation.

#### VI. **SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS**

Based on the exhibits, witnesses' testimony, officer's statements, and the record as a whole, presented or available to the primary inspector, the following findings of facts were determined:

On July 5, 2017, Sergeant Beauchamp was the shift supervisor at the Calhoun Work Camp

In his incident report dated July 5, 2017, Sergeant William Beauchamp indicated the following:

when Officer Monique Glass initiated Incident Command System (ICS) at approximately 1:1 p.m. due to Inmate Morales appearing and being combative. Sergear Beauchamp entered L2 dormitory where several inmates restrained Inmate Morales from being combative. Inmate Morales was restrained
Morales. At approximately 1:20 p.m. was notified due to Inmate Morales at approximately 1:30 p.m. and transported Inmate Morales at approximately 1:40 p.m. pronounced Inmate Morales deceased.
At the time of this incident there was no fixed wing video available for review.
Nine (9) digital photographs were taken of Inmate Morales  The visual review and photographic review found no evidence to Inmate Morales.
On July 5, 2017, Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Agents Charles Dickson and Travi Lawson responded to Calhoun Correctional Work Camp as part of this death investigation where sta and inmate interviews were conducted. Fourteenth District Medical Examiner Investigator Andrew Winkler responded and transported Inmate Morales after jurisdiction was accepted to allow for a autopsy.
AUTOPSY/TOXICOLOGY REPORT
In an autopsy report dated July 24, 2018, Medical Examiner Jay Radtke noted the cause of death as combined with a manner of death being an accident. In Doctor Radtke's report, the summary of the autopsy findings included the following:

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In a toxicology report dated July 3, 2018, by Diane Boland Ph.D with the Miami-Dade County Medical Examiner's Office, Inmate Morales
On Annual 40, 2040, EDLE Annual Bishoon forwards do constitue de la constitue
On August 10, 2018, FDLE Agent Dickson forwarded a case closure report involving Inmate Morales. Agent Dickson concluded, based on his investigative action, Inmate Morales death was the result of
Agent Dickson's investigation because of force used or signs of foul play.

Based on the information gathered during their investigation, it is the recommendation of FDLE Special Agent Charles Dickson the investigation found no violations of Florida Law.
